



EVERY 30-60 MINUTES

Clean the eyebrow with the non-alcoholic zappy wipes or cotton pads with clean water to remove all the lymph.



HOW DO I WASH MY FACE?

You can wash your face and shower as per usual. It's okay for your brows to contact water but avoid washing or rubbing your brows with soap.





HOT COMPRESS

First thing in the morning.

Soak a cotton pad with warm water and press it on the brows for 1 minute to soften any lymph that may have dried up throughout the night. Repeat 2-3 times till all the dry lymph are fully removed.



EVERY 1-2 HOURS

Continue to clean the eyebrow with the non-alcoholic zappy wipes or cotton pads with clean water to remove all the lymph.



DAY 3-5

Maintain facial hygiene.

Continue to clean the brows with the non-alcoholic zappy wipes / cotton pads with clean water 2-3 times a day.








EPITHELIAL CRUST STARTS TO FORM.

Apply the after-care cream if it starts to feel dry or itchy. <u>Gently dap the area</u> with non-alcoholic zappy wipes / cotton pads with clean water 2-3 times a day.

Do not scratch! -



DAY ONE TO DAY TEN

Avoid touching the area and do not use any products on the treated area.



Avoid doing workout, sauna, hot-spring, or anything that makes you sweat.



Avoid all facial treatments.



Avoid sunbathing or swimming.



FOR LONG-LASTING RESULTS

Maintain your usual moisturising and sunblock to protect the pigment for a long-lasting results.



AT ALL TIMES







Avoid chemical peelings, fruit acids, microdermabrasion, or cream that contains regeneration factors on the treated area.

Avoid solarium, light therapies, or laser treatments (Fraxel, laser, IPL) as they can destroy the pigment.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1

Can I use sheet mask over the area?

You can use a face mask once the scabbing is over. Typically after 7-10 days.

Can I draw my brows?

You can draw your brows once the scabbing is over. Typically after 7-10 days. When can I wash my face or apply sun block on the area?

You can do so once the scabbing is over. Typically after 7-10 days.



DAY 1


All eyebrow embroidery takes around 2-3 weeks to see the final result. These are some of the 'Don't Panic, it's normal' moments you will be expecting.

"The strokes look harsh and define, it's not the natural effect that I expected!"




"My skin is slightly red and why do I feel sore after the treatment?!"



DO NOT try to do anything to lighten or remove them. Anyone who has their brows done has been through this stage. You are just not used to the sudden change on your face. It is perfectly normal to feel this way. Freshly done brows will look 50% darker than the final results.













DON'T PANIC, IT'S NORMAL

Microblading is a technique done with an extremely fine blade to create little cuts on the skin. The numbing helps to prevent discomfort during the treatment, but you will start to feel a little sore when the numbing wears off. It is impossible not to feel any pain when you have so many cuts on the skin.



DAY 2-5

"Oh no! Why are they getting darker each day! Please make it stop!"



KEEP CALM & CARRY ON

Your skin is healing, and scab starts to form; just like any cuts on our body, it will create black scabs, making your brows look generally darker than before. This is part of the healing process, and it's definitely normal!



DAY 5-8


" It's super itchy and my brows are falling off! "


Bare with it. You're almost there! As the cuts created are extremely fine, the scabs form will look similar to your eyebrow hair. Don't worry, it's the scabs, not your brows! Avoid picking or scratching the scab, as this can interfere with healing and cause scarring.





DAY 8 - 10







" All the scabs are gone and so is the pigment! "

It is usual for a fresh wound to look slightly lighter; it takes around a week for the pigment to show up again!
